Dan joined Enterprise Inns plc in June 2014 as Group Health and Safety Manager. Previous to this he was an Environmental Health Officer who spent 15 years working in London, the majority of this time with Westminster City Council with over a decade spent in health and safety enforcement dealing with a number of high profile events including responding to the 7/7 bombings by assisting in the management of safety at the temporary mortuary site and overseeing the decontamination of a number of premises contaminated with radiation following the poisoning of Alexander Litvinenko. Dan was involved in the BRDO Primary Authority scheme and managed three health and safety partnerships, including one with Enterprise Inns.

Enterprise Inns is the largest pub company in the UK with over 5,000 premises in England and Wales operating on a leased and tenanted model having a net worth over £4bn. The key areas of the role are in ensuring the safety of the property estate (statutory compliance and construction safety) and in protecting the 500 company employees, over half of which are field based. The company has recently moved into the new area of operating its own Managed Houses which account for a small but significant area of the business and is a departure from the normal business model operated by the company.
